

## CWLF's

## Three Key Service Areas

Over the past 30 years, we have developed over 25 services in 3 key areas to address various issues affecting children and meet children's care needs.

## Family Preservation Services

We provide family preservation services for children and families who experience adversities and need financial support and professional social services. For children with trauma, in need of child protective services, going missing or in face of parental divorce, our family preservation services reach all corners of Taiwan including remote areas.

## Family Strengthening Services

We provide better childcare resources and support for families with children under 18 years old to effectively lower the risks of family crisis. The services include adoption services, various childcare support services for infants and toddlers who are in early developmental stages, and parenting and care support services for caregivers.

#### **Public Outreach**

We facilitate policy and regulation change on matters affecting children and families in Taiwan and conduct advocacy campaigns to raise awareness. We run various child empowerment projects. For specific issues, we also facilitate cross-agencies and cross-sectoral collaborations with the aim to make children's business everyone's business.

## Family Preservation Services

We provide family preservation services for children and families who experience adversities and need financial support and professional social services. The services include: Adopted Children and Biological Families Service, Children in Remote Areas Service, Family Mdiation Service, Family in Adversity Service, Child Protection and Trauma Service, and Missing Children and Youth Service.

## Family Intervention Service and Family-Based Care for Child Protection Placement in Taoyuan City Service



- Provided service for 307 families
- Safeguarded 373 children
- Conducted 16,789 visitations in 2021 with the average of 1,399 visitations (home visitations and telephone interviews) per month
- Provided daily supplies for 1,054 clients; provided subsidies for 444 times

#### Center for Child Trauma and Resilience



Provided service for 523 people



Conducted 3 cross-sectoral case conferences

### Trauma and Recovery Helpline (launched in June, 2021)

- Top 3 most asked questions:
- 1. Care for trauma clients and discussion on parenting
- 2. Consultation and referrals to Center for Child Trauma and Resilience service
- 3. Psychiatric resources

## Family Mediation Service

- Conducted 68 divorce focus groups with 431 participants
- Organized 95 divorce parenting forums with 1,421 attendants
- Conducted family mediation for 232 families with 3,021 clients
- Conducted 428 supervised visitation and handover sessions for 116 cases with 5,820 participants
- Provided consultations regarding post-divorce childcare plan and visitation for 1,888 people

Provided phone consultation service for 17,840 people with the average of 1,487 calls per month



Conducted 332 home-based childcare consultations for families with children under 6

Conducted in average 430 home visitations per month with the total of 5,161 visits

Provided service for 612 vulnerable families; safeguarded 1,255 vulnerable children



Provided daily supplies or other assistance to 1,726 children Provided financial subsidies for 607 children





## Children in Remote Areas Service

- Provided 5,251 disadvantaged students subsidies for daily expenses
- Provided 433 remote schools subsidies for development of 757 student clubs
- Provided 6,243 boxes of food consumed during school vacation
  (Due to the pandemic, each family received an additional box in summer vacation.)
- Provided 66 remote schools subsidies for hardware needed for online education during pandemic
- Provided 261 remote schools subsidies for their aftercare program giving 7,834 students
  place to do homework and study

## Missing Children and Youth Service

#### Missing Children Service



Received 5,524 calls from 0800 missing helpline



Provided service for 158 missing children and successfully found 66 children



Conducted online safety lectures for 8 schools with 2,621 participants

#### Parental/Family Abduction Service

Opened 141 family abduction cases;
 found 126 children; 104 cases in progress

#### Youth Service

- Conducted 6 online safety lectures with 1,394 participants
- Provided 2 class counseling sessions each for 8 classes with 402 participants
- Conducted 2 AR Puzzle Game activities for 237 people
- Conducted 1 online safety camp for 22 children

## **Family Strengthening Services**

We provide better childcare resources and support for families with children under 18 years old to effectively lower the risks of family crisis. The services include Adoption service, Childcare Support Services, Parent-Child Centers and Helpline Services.

## **Helpline Services**

#### Parenting Helpline

- Provided consultation to 1,159 caregivers
- Provided a total of 18,125 minutes consultation on phone
- Most asked questions: "child personal situations" and "family relationship issues"



#### Youth Helpline

- Received 3,610 calls
- Provided a total of 37,390 minutes consultation on phone
- Most asked questions: "personal issues" 62.9%, where "emotional distress" accounted for 25.9%

## Children Helpline

- Received 8,046 calls
- No. 1 reason to call in was "personal sharing" with 2,285 calls, including children's self-introduction, sharing their experiences, feelings and recreational activities.
- For calls discussing about worries, the most common topic was "worries about learning environment" (613 calls), from which 248 calls were about "interpersonal relationship." The other topics include stress of schoolwork (213 calls), teacher-student relationship (82 calls), worries among peers (76 calls), relationship issues (67 calls) and adaptation to new environment (26 calls)



#### **Adoption Service**

- Received 713 calls for adoption consultation
- Provided service for 10,443 adoptive families
- Conducted 12 sessions of adoption preparatory groups for 396 participants
- Conducted 25 sessions of adoption parenting education courses or groups for 291 participants
- Provided post-adoption services for 953 adoptive families
- Conducted 4 post-adoption reunion activities for 137 people
- Conducted 10 sessions of post-adoption parenting groups for 145 people

## Parenting and Childcare Support Service

Attachment & Biobehavioral Catch-up (ABC) Program and Taichung City Childcare Guidance Service



Provided ABC infant and toddler service for 48 clients with 168 courses



Provided 1,161 childcare consultation service



Home-based childcare guidance service: 111 families, 251 people



Thematic parenting courses: 34 courses, 983 people



Service promotion: 9 promotional activities, 3,639 people

#### Professional Toddler Guidance Service

- Provided service for 44 preschools in Taipei City for 91 families and 96 children
- Conducted 31 promotional activities for 437 participants
- Conducted 1 toddler emotion group for 7 participants
- Conducted 1 parent mindfulness group for 5 participants



#### Childcare and Parent-Child Service



#### Welcome to Our Comfort Zone

- Conducted caregiver respite and therapeutic series courses and parent-child series courses for 2,225 people
- Conducted 26 series courses and activities with 158 lessons
- Due to pandemic, we developed 10 different online science kits with 2,000 packages; developed 10 online science tutorial videos with 979 views; conducted 8 online child activities for 56 people; livestreamed 3 parent-child yoga classes reaching 4,054 people
- Created online channel with "Play Out Children's Inner Voice" and "Children's
  Monthly Buzz Feed" series with 12 videos reaching 26,685 people
- Collaborated with Keep Going to conduct 1 child emotion course and 2 presentation ceremonies with 220 participants

## Parent Support Community Service Centers

- Provided childcare consultation for 977 people
- Conducted 256 parent-child activities for 2,844 people
- Conducted 98 parent groups for 359 families and 762 people
- Provided service for 5,776 people including 2,883 young children
- Created 10 different online parent-child interaction kits with 2,000 packages,
  Created 18 online parent-child interaction videos with 2,633 views

#### Taipei City Childcare Resources Center

- Updated and maintained Taipei City Infant and Toddler Childcare Service
  Resources Website with 24,250,364 views in total
- Provided infant and toddler childcare consultation and referrals for 7,398 people
- Conducted itinerant consultations for 102 childcare institutes
- Conducted 19 professional trainings for 824 Taipei City childcare practitioners
- Conducted 189 professional trainings for 14,944 Taipei City institutional care or family-based care practitioners

- Child development evaluation service: conducted 3 sessions with 46 participants
- Service during pandemic (venue closed): created 26 parent-child interaction videos



## Public Outreach

We facilitate policy and regulation change on matters affecting children and families in Taiwan and conduct advocacy campaigns to raise awareness. We run various child empowerment projects. For specific issues, we also facilitate crossagencies and cross-sectoral collaborations with the aim to make children's business everyone's business. Our work includes Child Welfare Advocacy and Law Enactment, Child Empowerment and Educational Outreach Programs, Community Organization Coalition and Collaboration Service, and Trauma-Informed Care Resources Center.

## Child Welfare Advocacy and Law Enactment

#### Monitor Policy and Advocate for Law Amendment

- Organized 1 low birthrate forum, 2 press conferences, 1 focus group, 1 child protective practice workshop, 4 Regulations for Childcare Services amendment (civil society version) meetings
- Made 13 proposals to child welfare teams of local and central governments
- Attended 100 child welfare policy meetings
- Continued engaging in 7 organization coalition operational activities

#### Advocacy and Research Publication

- Conducted 4 social work practice evaluation surveys
- Ocompleted 12 surveys regarding Taiwanese children; 2 surveys in progress
- Participated in 45 domestic and international organizational meetings and activities
- Published 2 researches and 1 letter to the editor

#### Social Media and Initiatives

- Produced 36 episodes of Podcast with 16,654 downloads
- Produced 50 service promotion and advocacy videos with 700,000 views
- Published 1,011 posts on Instagram, Facebook and Twitter about service credit checking, advocacy on child related issues and parenting information reaching 16,938,000 people
- Maintained Welcome to Our Comfort Zone Facebook group with almost 4,000 members, 101,593 interactions and reaching 258,161 people
- Published 24 members newsletters to share service credit checking and advocacy with



## Child Empowerment and Educational Outreach Programs

- Provided 1,123 subsidies for 123 disadvantaged children covering music, dance and sports extracurricular activities
- Conducted 1 live band music event, 1 writing composition contest, 2 presentation ceremonies and 4 learning group events

#### Child Grief and Recovery Life Education Course

- Educational courses for teachers: 3 sessions for 132 participants
- Students class counselling: 8 sessions for 184 participants
- Student promotional courses: 9 sessions for 1,848 participants



## Trauma-Informed — Emotion Education to Reduce Bullying Course



- Parents courses: 6 sessions with 825 participants
- Teachers trainings: 58 sessions with 2,871 participants
- Student board game courses: 2 sessions with 55 participants

#### CRC Empowerment and Educational Outreach Program

- Conducted 17 CRC child empowerment sessions with 154 participants
- Conducted 6 CRC teacher and child worker empowerment sessions with 130 participants
- Conducted 23 CRC promotional courses with 918 teachers, 380 childcare givers,
  60 child workers and 220 children

#### Central Child and Youth Delegation Empowerment Program

Conducted 1 winter empowerment event, 1 summer empowerment event, 1 end of term assembly, 24 team meetings for 60 central child and youth delegates
